Mother Cecilia Meets With Wisconsin Sponsors

Cecilia Njeri, the Superior General of the Little Sisters of St. Francis (LSOSF). Mother Cecilia was accompanied by Sister Seraphine, the Education Representative on the LSOSF General Counsel.

Mother Cecilia expressed her heartfelt gratitude to sponsors and friends for their support and love of the Little Sisters and the children and families of Nkokonjeru.

We were gifted with sung prayer and the blessing of the Little Sisters present for those of us gathered, and

all of our sponsors with us in spirit. Also with Mother Cecilia and Sister Seraphine were several of the Little Sisters who are living and working in the United States serving the poor in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Besides the Midwest, the Little Sisters are also working in New York and Virginia.







Mother Cecilia took questions from sponsors and offered some background on the history of the Little Sisters of St. Francis of Assisi. She shared important news with us regarding Mother Kevin, the foundress of their order. An Irish nun, Mother Kevin worked for the advancement of medical care, education, and the empowerment of women in East Africa in the 1900s. Mother Kevin has been declared a Servant of God in the process of recognizing her as a Saint.

From One Sponsor To Another

Dear Fellow Sponsors,

In December of 2015 I, along with my husband and two twenty-something sons, started sponsoring a child. Sharon currently attends Stella Maris Secondary School in Nkokonjeru. This spring I decided that I wanted to meet Sharon as the letters we were receiving from her were not telling me enough about her to satisfy my need to know her. My oldest son Kyle was able to take two weeks out of his life here in the States to travel with me.



Our experience in Uganda was wonderful and we found ourselves "most welcome" to the country. Our home base was Providence Home (a residence for special needs children and adults) run by the Little Sisters of St. Francis (LSOSF) in Nkokonjeru.

Here reside three of the LSEF Ugandan team members, Sr. Angeline, Sr. Pontiano and Sandra. Sandra and Sr. Pontiano took us to visit many of the LSOSF schools and the children that are sponsored through the Little Sisters Education Fund. Several of the schools are in Nkokonjeru, but some are further away. We traveled in a Land Rover that maneuvered the dirt roads full of potholes and ruts. Many of the local people travel by boda bodas (small motorcycles) which weave in and out of traffic – very nerve wracking!



We were able to spend time with our child Sharon and we even met her Uncle (guardian) and the extended family!

Through Sr. Angeline, Sr. Pontiano and Sandra we learned about life in Uganda, the hardships of the local families and country and the tremendous work the LSOSF do to educate and medically treat the whole child with compassion despite the obstacles they face. They truly are Servants of God!

While in Nkokonjeru our home away from home was the Mother Kevin Guest House, a 20 minute walk to Providence Home. The house is very comfortable with five bedrooms with
