The first year of the Little Sisters Education Fund (LSEF) Committee has been a busy and productive one. We are very happy to inform you that with assistance from the Little Sisters of Saint Francis (LSOSF), and thanks to the generosity of our sponsors in 2017, sixty-nine children and young adults are currently receiving an education or vocational training at schools and universities throughout Uganda.

We are truly grateful for your support as we grow and expand our program in 2018 and look forward to providing greater numbers of disadvantaged and orphaned children with the financial means to obtain an education.

We're also in the process of developing our new website which will provide access to news and information about the LSEF, our students and the ways you are changing the life of a child through sponsorship.

We look forward to 2018 and another year filled with faith, hope and blessings for the volunteers, sponsors and especially the children in Uganda. A Blessed and Merry Christmas to you and your families.

Treasurer's Report by Terrance O'Neill

It has been an exciting and challenging year for the Little Sisters Education Fund. A small group of volunteers organized this group under the direction of Sr. Lucy Marindany and sent funds to Uganda for twenty-seven students last February. There are now sixty-nine students being sponsored in this organization with sixty different sponsors. The students range from nursery school through primary and secondary school and including vocational school and universities.

There are seven highly energetic and active volunteers in Milwaukee working to support this effort. We are compensated zero dollars. There are three people in Nkokenjeru, Uganda on the ground, working with the students and administrating the program.

Of all the funds we send to Uganda 95% pays for school fees, school requirements, and personal needs. The administrative cost in Uganda is under 5%. These expenditures are for supplies, communication, transportation, etc. The administrative costs in the U.S. is slightly less than five percent (5%) of donations; used for banking and credit card fees, postal charges, web development, etc. In summary, over ninety percent (90%) of your donations are going directly



to the education of your student.

We are currently reviewing all of the program fees to determine if the costs of sponsorship can be adjusted to more accurately reflect the cost of the education and support of your sponsored child.

In January you will receive a 2017 Charitable Contributions Statement.

In the new year we hope to continue to grow in sponsorships. Please help to spread the good work of the Little Sisters of St. Francis.
